



Here are some additional Covid-19 field precautions

- Share Site preparedness from GC and contractors – what has been implemented and what extra measures have been put in place outside of gov't requirements? Post in site offices and review daily
- Implement a daily worker checklist to document how they are feeling when arriving at site.
- Have toolbox/tailgate meetings in smaller work groups and observe social distancing
- Complete hazard assessments as individuals so that there are no group gatherings
- Do not use other tools, pencils, markers, computers, phones etc.
- Safety Absolutes – no leeway, non-compliance must be enforced immediately and severely. Demonstrates total commitment
- Dedicated person to continually make observations for compliance – COVID-19 Compliance Officer (CCO)
- Collaboration between trades for scheduling of work within constricted areas to allow for Social distancing – am/pm, alternate days
- Crews to sanitize common areas, port-o-potties, lunch areas, offices etc
- Staggered break times and areas – encourage use of personal vehicles to lessen lunchroom density – allow for social distancing
- Appreciative approach to call ins for self isolation for workers who have symptoms
- A respectful procedure for dealing with workers on site that are exhibiting symptoms and must be asked to leave and self isolate – reassure and provide all government links to access assistance packages
- Ensure employees have all PPE and sanitizing products that are required – maybe create schedule to have a rotational shift for sanitizing in office or sites – involve all employees
- Let workers know that they do have a right to refuse – expand parameters to include workers with symptoms of COVID-19
- Move to electronic orientations and sign-in/out by text – Webinars – Zoom meetings
- Establish times for use of handwash areas and sanitizer – first thing when arriving on site, at coffee before eating anything, after using washrooms, again before lunch, at the end of day.
- Have a change of clothes to change into before heading home so you don't wear your work clothes home.
- Constant reminders not to touch your face, keep hands in pocket when having conversations, no physical contact with anyone.
- Keep work pairs that have not had any symptoms together
- Try to discontinue hiring as you don't know what the new hire may have been exposed to.
- Ensure that mobile equipment is wiped down before and after each use if being used by other workers
